

Paul's Missionary Journey's

1st Missionary Journey – Acts 13/14 (Paul & Barnabas) Antioch – Cyprus – Perga - Pisidian Antioch – Iconium – Lystra – Derbe Returned via cities except left Attalia for Antioch

2nd Missionary Journey – Acts 15:36-18:22 (Paul & Silas)

[Paul and Barnabas disagreed – Barnabas took Mark and went to Cyprus] Jerusalem – Antioch - through Cilicia – Derbe – Lystra Into regions of Phrygia and Galatia; Mysia (prevented from entering Bithynia) to Troas and then into Macedonia Troas – Samothrace – Neapolis – Philippi – Thessalonica – Berea – Athens – Corinth – Ephesus –

3rd Missionary Journey – Acts 18:23-21:19 (Paul & various companions)
Paul's 2nd journey sees his ministry base move from Antioch to Ephesus
Paul stayed in Ephesus 3 years (Acts 19)
While here he enters correspondence with the church at Corinth
Paul decides to head for Jerusalem (Acts 19:21)
Paul and his companions head to Troas and then on to Macedonia and Greece before returning to Troas (Acts 20:1-6)
From Troas they sailed through the region arriving at Miletus where Paul said farewell to the Ephesian elders (Acts 20)
From Miletus to Kos to Rhodes and then on to Tyre, Ptolemais and Caesarea before heading to Jerusalem
In Jerusalem, Paul was arrested (Acts 21:30)

Paul's trip to Rome – Acts 21:30-28:16

Caesarea – Jerusalem – Antioch

Following Paul's arrest – he addressed the crowd and the Sanhedrin There is a plot to kill him, so he is transferred to Caesarea (Acts 23:23) In Caesarea he appears before Felix, Festus and King Agrippa Paul appeals to Caesar and is shipped to Rome (Acts 27) Sail via Myra and Cnidus to Crete arriving at Fair Havens The Romans wanted to winter in Phoenix against Paul's advice Boat drifted and ran aground in Malta. After 3 months set off and landed in Syracuse (Acts 28:11-12) Then to Rhegium, Puteoli and then Rome It is generally accepted that Paul was released after 2 years house arrest (although had reasonable freedom) From there travelled back to Ephesus, into Macedonia and Crete before his widely accepted visit to Spain (Pastoral Letters) It was while here that Nero came to power

NB The Apostle John was imprisoned on the island of Patmos (Revelation)
